- Submit a minimum of 150 photos in total from all three locations in JPEG and RAW formats on electronic media.

Video graphing - 30 days:

The <u>video production</u> will similarly adopt a documentary style, capturing authentic moments and emotions, with a focus on advocacy. The videos will promote gender equality, challenge gender stereotypes, and highlight the crucial role of midwives in reproductive health. We will seek out compelling stories that showcase the positive impact of UNFPA's programs in these areas.

In total, 3 videos will be produced capturing activities in all three locations on the following topics:

- 1. Promotion of gender equality in the family;
- 2. Engagement of men in promoting gender equality and empowering girls in sports;
- 3. Technology facilitated gender-based violence;
